



Since 1995, EHF has donated Dog Crossing road signs to the Rarotonga community. These bright yellow caution signs have been placed along the island road where collisions are most likely to occur. They increase road safety not only for dogs, cats and chickens but for humans too. They alert tourists to keep a watchful eye and remind all motorists to drive cautiously to avoid the many potential hazards on the island road.



These signs have been extremely popular with tourists, many stop by the EHF Animal Clinic hoping to purchase a sign as a souvenir, with magazine photographers and unfortunately, with local "collectors" who have taken the signs over the years.

In 2008, the foundation again sent twelve new replacement signs as the foundation's contribution to road safety and to decrease the number of patient surgeries and client heartaches.

To minimize loss, EHF's new signs include tamper resistant fasteners.

All that is required to erect the replacement signs is permission from authorities to repost them as we have in the past along the road.

Although we have not yet received authorization, we hope that this will change soon.
